POSITION DESCRIPTION

The Program Coordinator improves access to diapers and other daily essentials for Sacramento County families through supporting partnerships with community groups, food pantries, faith-based organizations, and health care providers.

The <u>Program Coordinator</u> will perform the following job functions (including but not limited to):

- Provide support and oversight to facilitate logistics of SFBFS' diaper distribution efforts. This includes:
 - Serving as the primary point of contact for diaper distribution partners regarding diaper orders, inventory, transportation/pick-up logistics, distribution, and reporting
 - o Tracking and overseeing program activities and agency reporting
 - Collaborating with the Community Resource Manager on the evaluation of program objectives and grant reports
 - o Maintaining relationships with existing community partners and cultivating partnerships with additional community organizations
 - o Providing community partners onsite assistance and training, as needed
 - Conducting site visits of distributions facilitated by community partners to ensure products are being distributed safely and according to program requirements
 - With management support, oversee product inventory and allocations to community partners
 - Assist with developing and refining program materials, procedures, and reporting processes
- Other duties as assigned

SKILLS REQUIRED

- Ability to provide support through increasing access to diapers, food, and other daily essentials
- Bachelor's degree or two years of related work experience
- Ability to:
 - Interpret and explain Food Access program policies and procedures
 - Communicate effectively orally and in writing
 - Maintain and develop relationships with a diverse population
